
Note for the Students:

10. Read the given text and make a timeline of events.

Tasmania was originally called Van Diemen's Land. In 1853, the name was changed to Tasmania because the colony had become self-governing and the convicts had stopped coming.

Because Tasmania is such a small island, most of the journeys made by explorers were short. However, some of these journeys were difficult because of the harsh land, steep mountains, dense bush and fast rivers.

In 1793, Lieutenant John Hayes named the Derwent River and George Harris sailed the Huon River in 1804. Lieutenant Thomas Laycock became the first person to cross Van Diemen's Land when he travelled from Port Dalrymple to Hobart. Charles Grimes followed the Jordan Valley, crossing the island from south to north. In 1815-16, James Kelly and four companions circumnavigated the island in a whaleboat. On the west coast Kelly gave Macquarie Harbour its name. In 1819-20, Henry Rice explored much of the east coast, discovering some good farming land. James Hobbs and twelve convicts explored the west coast in two whaleboats in 1824. They came across dense bush and steep mountains inland.

Henry Hellyer explored the north-west of Tasmania in 1827. He named many places such as Hampshire Hills and St. Valentine's Peak. In the same year, Joseph Fossey trekked overland from Launceston to Emu Bay (now called Burnie).
